Brake Fluid Testing

Automotive brake fluid does a great job of activating the brake cylinders that, in-turn, push the brake shoes against the drum, so we can stop our Studebaker when we need to. However, brake fluid has a downside you need to be aware of, namely; it absorbs moisture from the environment. The technical term for this is that it is Hygroscopic. Hygroscopic is the phenomenon of attracting and holding water molecules via adsorption from the surrounding environment. When this occurs, the moisture content can change the chemistry of the brake fluid, which can negatively affect how well your brakes work. Additionally, the extra moisture will cause the metal in your braking system to begin to corrode and rust.

This hit home recently as I've been helping a young fellow resurrect his 1957 Studebaker Transtar pickup. While jockeying the truck around the yard, one of the rear brakes locked up solid. No amount of rocking it with the engine would free it. This could have been disastrous if we'd been out and about town in it.

I found the brake master cylinder was full of brake fluid, but it was a dirty rusty brown color, certainly not what I expected to see. Tearing into the brakes I found the wheel cylinder components were rusty and inhibiting the free movement of the components which is why the wheel had locked-up.

Seeing this, I became concerned about the brakes in our other Studes. What I needed was a quick and easy way to check the moisture content of brake fluid. The answer was found in a small device that looks like an ink pen called a Brake Fluid Tester available at auto parts stores and online parts outlets as well, often for less than \$20.

Powered by a small battery, the tester has green, yellow and red LEDs, and two metal contacts at one end. **Operation is simple:** install the battery, turn on the tester, dip the metal contacts into the fluid bowl of your brake master cylinder. The tester measures the moisture content and lights up the appropriate LED. Before testing the Transtar, I tested an old bottle of DOT3 that's been on the shelf for several years. It lit up the yellow LED. I also tested a new bottle of DOT3 and it lit up the green LED. When I tested the Transtar, the tester lit up the red LED indicating too much moisture in the brake fluid – thus confirming why I was seeing the rust in the brake system.

We all spend a lot of time making our Studebakers look good. Why not spend a minute checking your brake fluid to ensure you and your family's safety?!

Ambient Air Temperature Sensors



Picture a hapless June Bug fluttering across a road when the left outside mirror on a RAM 2500 pickup hits it. The bug is pulverized, but surprisingly, the massive pickup truck suffers too. The check engine light comes on, and the air conditioner stops working. The bug happened to hit the Ambient Air Temperature Sensor, one of the

sensors used to control the truck's heat and air conditioning system.

Ambient Air Temperature Sensor (measures outside temperature): On most vehicles, this sensor is behind the grille or front bumper cover. On some RAM pickups, the sensor is in the drivers side mirror. If the sensor is damaged then the outside air temperature

readout on the dash or rearview mirror may suddenly display numbers that are impossibly cold (or hot). The air conditioning may turn off because the computer now thinks it is too cold outside to safely run the AC compressor. The check engine light may come on because the extremely cold (or hot) ambient air temperature is incompatible with signals from other temperature sensors (engine air intake temperature, engine coolant temperature...).

Bug guts or mud may just block rather than damage the sensor. The vehicle owner might also inadvertently block airflow to the sensor by installing something like a license plate or fog lights in front of it. A RAM truck owner might accidentally completely remove the sensor by replacing the truck's sensor-equipped outside mirror with a sensor-less mirror made for a different option package (towing mirrors, unheated mirrors...).

WHEN QUALITY WAS THE NAME OF THE GAME By Dan Kuhl

The other day Cal Basnitz found me at the Club shop and said he had found something at the Mayo Clinic that

would pique my interest, and he was right. Studebaker is alive and well at the Mayo.

In the late 1800's the Mayo Brothers William and Charles then at a young age, were already honing their

medical skills. Their father who was a doctor introduced his sons to compounding pills and potions prescribed for patients. Later they both attended medical school and returned to Rochester, MN, where the Mayo Clinic first opened its doors at the beginning of the 20th Century. They were both surgeons with William specializing in

abdominal surgery and Charles specializing in head and neck surgery. In the 1890's they traveled far and wide to study aseptic techniques. They learned washing their hands before surgery and the use of gloves prevented infection. They soon realized their services at Mayo were limited in scope and brought in other specialists

that broadened the care offered by the Clinic. People would come from all over the world for the Clinic's medical care. By 1905 the services included diagnostic and research specialties. Also, in 1905 they began offering ambulance service to the Rochester area using a horse-drawn ambulance manufactured by Studebaker. Studebaker who had been manufacturing wagons and carriages in South Bend IN since 1852 had become the world's largest manufacturer of horse-drawn conveyances at the time of the ambulance's purchase. After 10 years of use the Studebaker was replaced with Mayo's

first motorized ambulance, a 1912 Packard. The Studebaker was then relegated to storage at the Mayo estate and recently brought to Phoenix for display at the Mayo Clinic's first hospital located in Scottsdale which opened in 1998. The Studebaker is located in Bldg. 3 of the hospital campus, which is accessible just south of the 101 in Scottsdale. Studebaker's best-known mantra is "Always Give More Than

You Promise". I believe the Mayo Brothers believed in the same, giving patients the best possible care available. Today, Clinic's reputation speaks for itself. Thank you Cal for providing me with a great piece of Studebaker history. I will soon make a visit.
